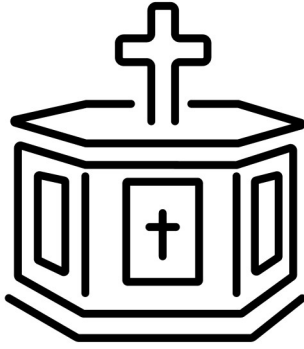

CHRISTIAN SYMBOL

SHIP — The Christian church has long been symbolized by a ship. While the Old Testament tells of Noah's ark preserving righteous people during the flood, the New Testament recounts Jesus calming the storm that battered the disciples' fishing boat. St. Ambrose described the church as a ship with the cross as its mast, and others have compared salvation to being drawn out of the sea of death into the safety of the church (ship). Indeed, many large churches are constructed to represent a big boat, with the main worship space called the nave — Latin for ship.

EASY PUDDING*

Almagene Brown

3/4 cup sugar

2 T. flour

2 T. cornstarch

1 tsp. vanilla

1/4 tsp. salt

2 egg yolks

2 cups milk

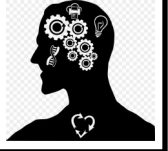
2 T. butter

Beat ingredients with mixer. Cook and stir constantly over medium heat until thick and first begins to bubble. Remove from heat and add vanilla and butter.

*Variations: coconut or chocolate chips may be added while still warm. Brown sugar may be substituted for granulated sugar for butterscotch pudding.

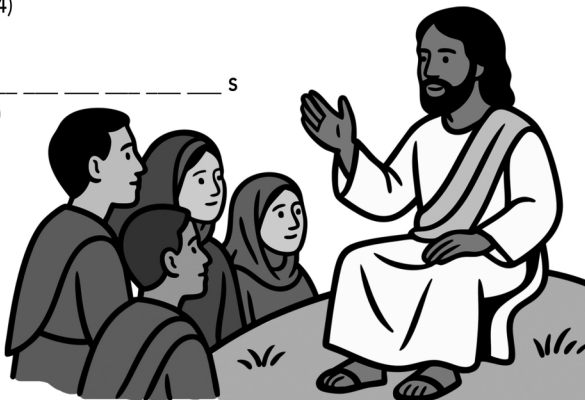

"A church where everybody is somebody, and Jesus Christ is Lord"

It's risky to venture into the comments section of online news sites. Risky, but fascinating. Commenting on an interview with a millionaire endeavoring to live forever in this life, one reader posted this from Matthew 16:25: "'Whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it.' - Jesus." Reacting to that comment, another reader posted, "Wasn't there a book written about Him?" To which a third reader replied, "Yes, Fiction."

There are always those who will mock belief in Jesus. When the apostle Paul stood in a public forum to tell a large group of Athenians about Christ, results were mixed. "When they heard about the resurrection of the dead, some of them sneered" (Acts 17:32). Others, however, said, "We want to hear you again on this subject" (V.32). And

some believed (v.34).

How others respond to the truth of the Bible is between them and God. But it's the claim that we can live forever in this life that's fiction. Our bodies are destined to die. In contrast, the Bible tells us of the one who is "the way and the truth and the life" (John 14:6). Like Paul, it's our task to share with anyone who will listen what this Man has done for us. We can trust the Holy Spirit to do the rest.

How do you feel when others mock your faith? Why is it important to let them know what you believe about Jesus?
